• Course description & Objectives

This course is designed for students who can use the short sentence of elementary level with correct pronunciation. Students will study the topics such as making reservation, taking transportation, shopping, using hospital, etc. to develop communicative skills in daily life's context. At the end of the semester, students will communicate without big difficulty on the topics using the sentences and words given during the course. Various kinds of materials will be introduced to help students' understandings, and 4 language functions (speaking, listening, writing, and reading) will be all trained.
