This course is designed for students who fluently use sentences of elementary level with correct pronunciation and understand complex and compound sentences. This course requires students to write and discuss about various topics. After taking this course, students will be able to present opinions in sentences and words in both daily and formal situations. All four language functions (speaking, listening, writing, and reading) will be trained and various materials will be introduced to help students' understandings.

1. Since we will learn many new grammars and expressions that are not easy to learn on your own, **your attendance is strongly encouraged**. Your physical presence is necessary condition to learn Korean language. Come and participate in the class. Three 10 minutes late attendance will be counted as one absence. Any student who is absent for more than 1/3 of the semester will be issued an "F" regardless of his/her achievement in the course.

2. There will be word quizzes. Word quiz includes vocabulary & expressions from next chapter. If you are late for the quiz, you will only have the remaining time to finish it. You can have a make-up word quiz if you **ask for prior permission** with a really reasonable reason but you would **only get 80% of the result**. (80% is the maximum you can receive.)

3. There will be one presentation during the semester;. Every student will give a presentation (4-5 minutes) in Korean on the given topic based on the chapters of the textbook.

4. There will be one debate during the semester. Students will be divided into two groups (for or against) for the given topic ahead of time. Groups are expected to **meet separately outside of class** and must come **prepared and ready to debate**. Debate will last 20-30 minutes.

5. Midterm exam and Final exam are written exams and will take place twice a semester respectively.
