

Korean Language II (Spring 2019)

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● Course description & Objectives

This course is designed for students who can use the short sentence of elementary level with correct pronunciation. Students will study the topics such as making reservation, taking transportation, shopping, using hospital, etc. to develop communicative skills in daily life's context. At the end of the semester, students will communicate without big difficulty on the topics using the sentences and words given during the course. Various kinds of materials will be introduced to help students' understandings, and 4 language functions (speaking, listening, writing, and reading) will be all trained.

1. Class attendance is **mandatory** and there will be no make-up exam without the permission of teacher.

You can have a make-up word quiz if you **ask for prior permission** with a really reasonable reason but you would **only get 80% of the result.** (80% is the maximum you can receive.)

3. Assignment (homework for exercise of vocabulary and grammar for each chapter) must be handed in the beginning of the class.

4.5. Mid-term & Final exam include written exams. Written exams will take place twice a semester respectively.
